






Description

The Seward Highway: 36th Avenue Interchange project will improve safety for all transportation modes and reduce delays by constructing a new interchange at the intersection of Seward Highway and 36th Avenue. This is one of the busiest and highest-crash-rate intersections in the municipality of Anchorage. Bicyclists and pedestrians report that it is difficult to cross the highway and users report a general lack of east-west connectivity in the area. Planned improvements include grade separations, highway ramps, non-motorized facilities, and new frontage roads connecting Tudor Road to 36th Avenue.

This project will increase connectivity by:

- Improving flow for all travel modes
- Supporting the separation of local trips from through trips
- Improving facilities for pedestrians and bicyclists
- Reducing delays and the risk of collisions




